#### **BURGLARY RESIDENTIAL**

**Leeds Road, Scholes**

**Occurred between 03.00 and 05.00 on 06/09/2019.**

Between times and date stated unknown suspect enters through rear patio door by snapping lock. Conducts untidy search before stealing vehicle using car keys.

#### **BURGLARY RESIDENTIAL**

**Rakehill Road, Scholes**

**Occurred between 02/09 and 06/09**

Suspect/s enters residential attached garage with no integral access by damaging the twisting handle lock by means unknown. Once inside removes property then leaves unseen.

**BURGLARY RESIDENTIAL**

**Elmete Avenue, Scholes**

**Occurred at 22.30 on 06/09/2019**

Between times stated unknown suspect/s have entered garden by unknown means and opened shed door. Using tools from shed have open cellar door and attempted to open conservatory door have made off when disturbed by occupants down driveway.

**CRIMINAL DAMAGE**

**Belle Vue Road, Scholes**

**Occurred between 19.30 on 10/09/2019 and 07.00 on 11/09/2019**

Damage caused to victim's vehicle believes he may know who is responsible.

**BURGLARY RESIDENTIAL**

**Morwick Grove, Scholes**

**Occurred at 22.30 on 16/09/2019**

Victim whilst in bed has heard a noise outside of location. Victim has seen three males next to the shed through the window all wearing dark hooded tops. Victim has banged on the door which has caused the three males to run away over the fence. Slight damage caused to shed door by suspects.

**CRIMINAL DAMAGE**

**Chapel Lane, Barwick**

**Occurred on the 24/09 between 16.00 and 16.40**

Suspect places paper into the lock barrel of door lock causing damage and making it unusable.

**BURGLARY RESIDENTIAL**

**Elmwood Lane, Barwick**

**Occurred at 22.40 on 26/09/2019**

Victim has been sat at home when they have seen a male coming down their drive with a head torch on. Victim has opened window and asked male what he was doing. Suspect has said "give us your keys" the victim has then given foot chase to suspect. Suspect has got into a vehicle and been driven off at speed.

**Euro cylinder locks**

**Love your locks. You deserve the highest standards**



Are the cylinder locks on your UPVC doors up to standard?  
Do they stick out from the door handle?  
Is the door handle secure?

**Euro Cylinder Locks - Key Facts:**

- All euro cylinder locks on the external doors to your home should either meet TS 007 (3 star rating) or Sold Secure Diamond Standard for lock cylinders (SS312)
- Door handles should meet TS 007 (2 star rating)
- Cylinders should be measured correctly and fit flush to the handle or door
- The installation of sash jammers can also act as an extra deterrent

- Consider setting up a Neighbourhood Watch scheme on your street
