

The Leeds City Council "LOCAL DEVELOPMENT FRAMEWORK" is a document which will determine the future planning policies and most matters which affect our daily lives, for the next two decades. The Parish Council has submitted a representation after carefully considering the "core strategy". Whilst recognising that affordable housing in the wider context, the protection of the greenbelt and the environment within and surrounding our Parish are essential issues we have reflected these views in our response to the draft proposals.

More than 350 objections were lodged against the recent appeal by 02 for a bigger **MOBILE PHONE MAST** in Highfield Lane off Long Lane in Barwick

The new **HERITAGE LIGHTS** are more or less complete in **Scholes** and will soon be complemented by new street signs. Additional heritage lighting is also scheduled for **Barwick** in the next few months.

A new **VILLAGE CLOCK** has been erected outside the Dental Surgery in Station Road, Scholes funded from the Blackburn Legacy. It was sited courtesy of Dr. Alan Stanley and very kindly installed by David Horkan.

DRAINAGE problems have still to be resolved in Main Street, Scholes near to the St.Philip's Church and Barleycorn Pub. On going efforts with Yorkshire Water will hopefully soon result in some improvement.

We are delighted that **Peter Taylor** from Scholes has agreed to lead our **PARISH PATHS VOLUNTEERS** following the retirement of **Harold Smith** who has undertaken these duties for the past ten years. Within the Parish there are 22 miles (35 km) of foot and bridle paths and 66 stiles & gates plus 12 bridges which are in constant need of repair and upkeep. Our PPV's have also spent a great deal of time and effort to keep

the paths clear of vegetation which benefits both the Parish and the hundreds of walkers who enjoy the wonderful countryside on our doorstep. Harold is heavily involved in the Barwick Historical Society and in particular the Earthworks Care projects. Peter Taylor, a founder member of the PPV's is also footpath secretary of the Leeds Group of the Ramblers' Association and has some experience of legislation relating to "rights of way". Have you noticed the new **BUS SHELTER** at the Station Road/Rakehill Road junction in Scholes. A second refurbished and matching shelter should by now be in position opposite. Further discussions with WYPTE are ongoing in relation to the 64 service through Scholes from Barwick during off peak period.

BUS SERVICE: subject to receiving a licence from the Traffic Commissioner **Geldard's Coaches** are proposing to introduce an off peak (9am-3pm Mon-Fri) hourly service in both directions starting in early March with a circular route from Aberford turning circle via Barwick in Elmet, Scholes, A64 to Tesco's at Seacroft, Crossgates, Sainsbury's at Colton, A63, Garforth Main Street, over railway bridge past Tesco and back to Aberford. We understand that all Metro concessionary passes will be honoured. Details Geldards Coaches 263 9491

Residents will no doubt be concerned at recent publicity concerning the **POSSIBLE CLOSURE of ONE or BOTH of our POST OFFICES.**We are advised that an Area Plan (Post Office Ltd's proposals) for West Yorkshire will be published in **May** whereupon the public will have **six weeks** to comment prior to a final decision being taken. If we are not to lose one or both PO's then hard evidence will be required in making our case which needs to be well documented. The Parish Council intends to circulate details and a questionnaire in due course in order to present a compelling case for the continuation of our existing Post Office facilities.
