DOGS BANNED from JACK HEAPS FIELD

Due to the irresponsible behaviour of dog owners who fail to clear up after their dogs the Parish Council has unanimously decided that dogs will be banned from this area in future. The land was donated to the Parish by Jack Heaps and was intended as a general area for recreation. It is therefore unacceptable that dog mess is left as a danger to children and others. It is regretted that responsible dog owners who do use the dog bin provided will find this ban of some inconvenience but the welfare of the children is of primary importance. Leeds City dog wardens will be keeping a close watch on the situation. There is general concern throughout the Parish at irresponsible dog owners who do not clear up after their dogs and efforts will be made to prosecute if appropriate.

Dog owners are advised that it is now permissible to place plastic dog poo bags in the weekly rubbish bins.

"MEMORIAL TREES" NOW PROTECTED

The avenue of 67 trees lining Station Road & Scholes Lane is now protected with TPO's (tree preservation orders) following confirmation of the order at a meeting of Leeds City Council Plans Panel East held on 12 Feb. The 23 **Memorial Trees** on Station Road were originally planted following the first world war to commemorate the Scholes men who gave their lives in the service of their country and of course serve also as a tribute to those who failed to return after the second world war and other conflicts.

acclaimed CHRISTMAS much GHTS in Barwick's Main Street were provided through a grant from Leeds City Council's North East (Outer) Area Committee Well Being Fund with support from Ward Councillors Ann Rachael Procter and Alec Shelbrooke. Thanks are also due to Harry Rhodes and his team at Leeds Lights who supplied and erected the display and will store the equipment until next December. The Parish Council is responsible for the ongoing cost of erection and storage each year. Thanks are also due to Jim and Eileen Jackson at The Coach House as owners of the tree outside the post office and to Councillor John Tinker who initiated the idea. Jack Heaps Field was of course donated to the Village with ownership vested in the Parish Council. The Lights were connected to the street lighting system. A huge number of compliments have been received from residents and visitors travelling through the village.

Following the success of this initiative the Council has agreed to extend the festive spirit to Scholes by including the Coronation Tree at the junction of Main Street and Leeds Road and perhaps one other tree in Station Road to cover both ends of the village.

Scholes CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUND is due for improvement and renovation shortly. The hawthorn hedge is being removed in order to provide improved visibility to eliminate anti social behaviour with a new and lower bow top fence. A number of new items of equipment are also planned for the youngsters to enjoy.

Scholes SCOUTS are celebrating the connection of a new lamp post kindly donated by SEC - Southern Electric Contracting (who are replacing all of the lighting in the Parish) in order to light the very dark area outside their HQ on the unmade section of Rakehill Road.

A presentation and consultation event on the future of CHIPPY'S POND at Wood Lane in Scholes was made to the December meeting of the Council by Fred Duff, Senior Area Manager of LCC Parks & Countryside Service when it was revealed that West Yorkshire Police use the pond for underwater training of divers. The proposed works include better access. interpretation, footpath resurfacing, provision of new benches and litter bins. Improvements to the nature areas were also proposed including the clearing of debris from the pond and the establishment of a new wildflower meadow. A budget had identified but there were heen problems in respect of vandalism and access due limitations on ownership issues of adjacent land. STREET LIGHTING in the Parish as a whole is currently being upgraded by Southern Electric Contracting (SEC) and in Barwick there will be additional heritage style fittings with brackets for hanging baskets to complement those existing in the Conservation Area and in Scholes.

BARWICK in ELMET village will be competing in the *Britain In Bloom* competition this year and will also be staging their **OPEN GARDENS DAY** on Sunday 28 June. Scholes village will also be holding an Open Gardens event as part of their entry to *Yorkshire In Bloom* and this will take place on Sunday 12 July.
