

NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN Why do we need more homes in Leeds

- ◆ The populations of Leeds is forecast to grow by 90,000 by 2011-26
- ◆ In 2008 the number of new homes being built nationally had fallen to its lowest peacetime level since 1924, a trend reflected in Leeds and not kept pace with needs
- Household sizes are falling, people living longer, more accommodation for single/small households needed
- Meet the need for new affordable homes throughout the city
- People cannot afford to buy new homes, so they are sharing homes leading to overcrowding
- New homes support economic growth, including local jobs and training
- Record numbers of children are reaching school age. They will need new homes in 15 years time.
- Commercial and industrial growth in Leeds is expected to increase significantly in the next 20 years and homes needed for workers Good progress is being made with the Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) as evidence is gathered to support our resistance to development of sites identified by Leeds City Council. We will shortly approach a point where further public meetings will be arranged to provide updates to all residents and to provide opportunities for comment on the work completed so far and these will take place towards the end of the year. We will soon have 4 separate documents Parish Plan 2006 & 2012, Village Design Statement (VDS) and NDP. The first Plan was produced after responses from 45% of residents. The revised Plan in 2012 updated the objectives in the first plan and identified aspirations for the future. The VDS centres on physical character and design, what makes our Parish what it is and what is important for preservation. These documents will form part of the NDP as appendices. The NDP is about development of our Parish in planning terms - new homes, businesses, infrastructure and what is acceptable or not to our residents. NDP will be a Statutory Planning Document that planners and developers must take into consideration.
