Parish Council News

The Parish Council is looking for new members. Residents from both Barwick and Scholes are welcome to ask the Clerk for more information. Parish Council meetings are held once a month, on the first Monday of the month. Other committees meet monthly.

Kinga Ragg (Barwick Ward) was voted in as Chair of Finance and General Purposes Committee. This committee normally meets at the Pavilion second Tuesday of the month 7pm and is open to the public.

CIIr Brunt (Barwick Ward) resigned in June and therefore there are now three vacancies in the Barwick Ward. If you are interested in joining the Parish Council then please contact the Clerk or the Chair for further information. There is also one vacancy in Scholes Ward.

Scholes Pavilion Sports facilities which include a tennis court, MUGA pitch and exercise equipment are now fully open.

A refundable deposit of £5 is required for the fob. You must live in the Parish to be eligible for access to the main facilities.

Barwick in Elmet Hall Tower Motte and Bailey



Many residents exercise by running or walking around Barwick in Elmet streets. The PC are considering if there a possible alternative to improve facilities on Hall Tower. This could provide somewhere off road to exercise rather than pounding the pavements and dodging the traffic.

Hall Tower is owned by the Parish and many people do enjoy using it and views are being sought on how this area

may be improved. It may be possible to site a dedicated exercise track and exercise equipment on Hall Tower Field situated on the Bailey, the flat area around the Mott.

English Heritage have to be consulted over any changes and approval would also be required from Ancient Monuments. Provisional approval has been indicated subject to a survey of residents to assess the demand and submission of plans for an exercise track and sites for exercise equipment. Grant funding would also be required.

Barwick Methodist Chapel is 120 years old

The maintenance of this historic building is a constant problem and funds are urgently needed to help keep up with repairs and maintenance. For example, the spire needs to be repaired and estimated costs are in the region of £20,000.

The East Leeds Orbital Road (ELOR)

After all the upheaval of the road construction and road closures, ELOR has finally opened. We now wait to see what its impact will be on traffic flows in and around the parish. Highway Authorities usually wait for 12 months before taking any traffic management steps to deal with problems which may have arisen.

During this period there are a number of matters to be considered and addressed where necessary.

Scholes Lane End

As part of the planning permission for ELOR, Leeds City Council (LCC) are required to look at providing traffic lights at the junction of Scholes Lane and the A64. Although not part of the Balfour Beatty contract there is money in the budget to do this. LCC have drawn up a scheme which will have 2 lanes approaching the junction so vehicles turning right will not hold up vehicles turning left.

There will be consultation on these proposals by LCC and details will be provided on the Parish Council website when this is announced for those interested.

Better Cycling provision

Wood Lane, (the route from Scholes war memorial to Swarcliffe) has been upgraded to a bridleway which means it can now be used by cyclists and horse riders. A bridge has been installed across ELOR which will assist with access to Crossgates. Users will be able to access the new bridleway alongside the new road to visit the Springs and also Roundhay Park. Funding has been secured to construct a new train station at Thorpe Park and so in due course the combination of cycle route and train will offer a new form of commuting to those working in Leeds or York.

As part of the Scholes Lane junction improvements, LCC have agreed to explore the possibility of making the footway from Scholes Lane End to Thorner Lane dual use so cyclists do not have to use the main carriageway at this point.

Trees and landscaping

Although many trees have already been planted, the dry weather and programme delays has meant that more planting remains to be done in the autumn, which will include many more trees. Assurances have been given that any trees which die off will be replaced. A request has been made for some additional planting along Leeds Road.

Pedestrian Crossing

LCC have been asked to look at the possibility of installing a pedestrian crossing at Scholes Primary School. This would be a simple crossing so as not to cause a nuisance to neighbouring residents but to provide assurance and help for those accessing and leaving the school and the crossing patrol.

Next Steps updates will be provided as necessary in the newsletter.

Revision of Barwick and Scholes Neighbourhood Plan

In 2017 the Parish Council published the **Neighbourhood Plan (NP)** for Barwick and Scholes. This now has to be reviewed and renewed. The Parish Council has set up a **Working Party (WP)** to review the Plan and set out its new recommendations. The revised Plan will cover the period from 2023 to 2033. Residents' views are an essential part of this process and the WP are seeking your input into this review.

This note provides some thoughts from the WP on areas for improvement. It also includes ideas about matters which have arisen since the Plan was adopted which may be addressed in the revised Plan. We would like to know your thoughts on the opportunities for improvements and changes to the plan

The WP would like to hear from you as part of this consultation.



The 2017 Vision is in our view still appropriate,

"..for Barwick in Elmet and Scholes to maintain their essential character as a rural community; within easy reach of the city environs, yet separate and distinct at the same time. In maintaining this identity, we wish to ensure that our citizens are given opportunities to contribute to the vitality of the community; opportunities to work and learn in the community; opportunities to live healthy and satisfying lives in the community"

This Vision is supported by the following objectives,

- Maintaining the environment and distinctive character
- Ensuring sympathetic village and building design
- Ensuring an adequate housing supply
- Retaining strategic green corridors
- Developing community and business infrastructure make them more effective, relevant and robust.

Since the Plan was introduced a number of issues have arisen;

- The East Leeds Orbital Route (ELOR) has opened. This has given the Parish some challenges which need addressing. To provide oversight of the area between the Parish and the new road it is proposed to extend the Plan boundary to the eastern edge of ELOR.
- 2. The revised Plan will cover a period from 2023 to 2033, during which time LCC will review its housing requirements. The revised plan needs to contain policies that protect the local community in the event of any development in the Parish being approved.

3. Climate Change is now a pressing issue. The WP would welcome views on how far new development in the parish should comply with the impacts of climate change.

The WG are seeking your ideas on issues you think the Plan should address and any comments you may have on the existing policies.

The WP would like to hear from you as part of this consultation.
