The Parish Commemorated Remembrance Sunday on 13th November 2022

Why do we have a 2-minute silence on 11th November?

Armistice Day, or Remembrance Day, **marks the very day that World War One ended in 1918**. We hold a two-minute silence at 11am on the 11th day of the 11th month to remember those who have died in any military conflict since World War 1.

Armistice Day has been observed every year since 1919. As well as standing together in Remembrance on 11 November, we also observe a two-minute silence at 11am on Remembrance Sunday, which is 13th November this year.

On Remembrance Day, we acknowledge the courage and sacrifice of those who served their country and acknowledge our responsibility to work for the peace they fought hard to achieve.



Local Remembrance Day services particularly remember those people who were members of our community and served in a both the World Wars and more recent conflicts.

Remembrance does not glorify war and its symbol, the red poppy, is a sign of both Remembrance and hope for a peaceful future. The British Legion Poppy Appeal raises funds to supports veterans from all the services.

The Parish has records of the residents that died in the world War conflicts and the war Memorials in Barwick and Scholes are a tribute to the fallen. The War Memorial for Scholes can be viewed in the Manor House.

Many residents who were killed in the war are remembered in cemeteries in mainland Europe, when bodies were never found their names are inscribed in memorials in France, Belgium and Malta. No new names are added to memorials as they are now recorded at the National Arboretum, Alrewas, Staffordshire for all service personnel.

Services were held in both villages and members of the local British Legion led the parades and laying of wreaths at the memorials in the Parish.

They shall not grow old As we that are left grow old, Age shall not weary them Nor the years condemn, At the going down of the sun and in the morning we shall remember them.

A Message from All Saints' Church Wardens– appeal to dog owners.



The churchyard in Barwick is a place for the bereaved to visit the graves of loved ones. It **is not** a place to exercise dogs, provision for such is made on Hall Tower field a short distance away.

The church is reluctant to ban dogs totally as those tending graves are sometimes dog owners. However, it is very unpleasant for someone paying their respects or someone maintaining the graveyard to find their hands soiled by dog excrement.

Please show respect for the dead and for those who mourn, if you need to bring a dog into the churchyard, *please keep it on a lead* and if it needs to leave a parcel, please pick it up.
