

# Barwick in Elmet and Scholes Parish News Letter Feburary March 2023

The Parish Council has 2 wards: Barwick and Scholes.

There are 12 elected representatives (Parish Councillors) 6 in each ward.

Councillors are democratically elected every four years.

May 2023 will be the renewal of the Parish Council all current councillors have the opportunity to continue or stand down. An election has to be held if there are more than 6 candidates in each ward, if there are less then councillors are reinstated without an election. At the last elections Scholes held an election as there were 7 candidates, Barwick did not hold an election. The election costs have to be paid to LCC by the PC and are estimated to be approximately £12,000. This money has to be kept in reserves by the PC.

### **Parish Council Budget Decisions**

The new budget for 2023/2024 has been agreed. All aspects of the PC's budget have been reduced (40% compared to last year) and spending will be monitored carefully. The amount of money available is currently reduced and it is with regret that the PC has agreed to increase next year's precept by 10%. This will increase the total annual precept from  $\mathfrak{L}39,000$  to  $\mathfrak{L}43,000$  This decision has been made in order to secure sufficient funding for the future.

Before last year the precept had not been increased for several years and this has left the PC with no other option than to raise the precept. The average **annual** precept cost per household is approximately £28, depending on the council tax band. If your precept for the PC was £28 last year it will be £30.80 this year and £32.90 last year increases to £35.80. We have been very careful to keep costs as low as possible. As usual it will be collected by Leeds City Council via the Council Tax, you can see how much you pay on the LCC Council Tax bill.

In 2021/22 the budget contained significant items such as Scholes football pitch drainage and funding the Platinum Jubilee. Next year's projects include improvements to the Verity Strip, Barwick. We are trying to introduce a long-range plan and in order to do that we would like to hear residents' opinion regarding future projects. #### **Barwick Allotments**

# All dogs must be kept on leads on Parish Council Land

Due to the number of complaints regarding dog fouling and damage caused to land which is owned and maintained by the PC it has been agreed that **all dogs must be kept on leads in the following locations:** Barwick Playing Fields, All Saints Church, Jubilee Gardens, Barwick Orchard, Scholes Lodge Farm Field, Hall Tower Motte and Bailey, St Philips Garden. The PC request everyone to carry poo bags and pick up after their dog. Bags can be put in any rubbish bin. The PC have asked LCC Dog Warden's to do additional checks in the Parish.

Please keep your dog under control and on a lead at all times on Scholes and Barwick Playing Fields where cricket and football is played and used by children.

Dogs are not allowed on Jack Heaps Field as this is a children's play area. Please do not let your dog foul in these areas and clean up after them

#### Revision of Barwick in Elmet and Scholes Neighbourhood Plan

The Barwick in Elmet and Scholes Neighbourhood Plan is currently being reviewed to take into consideration the changes that have occurred locally since the plan was originally agreed.

**Update:** Drop-in sessions were held in the autumn in both Barwick and Scholes to give residents the opportunity to review the current Neighbourhood Plan and propose changes. Whilst a number of residents attended and expressed their views the overall attendance level was low. No major issues, apart from those described below were raised so the Plan can be revised with only minor alterations.

**Key Issues:** A key issue raised by a number of residents was the poor connectivity between the villages; including the lack of public transport and the poor condition of existing rights of way. How the revised Plan can deal with this is being examined. The desire to retain and to improve the character of the villages and designate more green spaces ensuring these are protected was a further issue identified and a number of sites have been suggested.

The current Plan does not address how the parish may respond to climate change. Leeds City Council have recently published proposals to encourage solar farms and wind turbines in open countryside and the Plan will need to consider how this should be implemented locally.

**External Pressures include** the proposals to build over 5,000 new houses on land between the new road and the edge of Leeds. It is estimated over a 10–15-year period the local population will increase by 15,000; putting an enormous strain on existing services such as transport, education and health. Whilst the new development will bring additional facilities these will need to be managed carefully to avoid an unacceptable impact on existing facilities in the parish. The Plan will have a limited role in this regard but the Group will seek to ensure the Plan takes these challenges into account.

The new road should provide a firm boundary edge to the eastward expansion of the Leeds urban area and the Parish Council had supported a proposal to extend the plan boundary to the edge of the new road. This would enable the Plan policies to protect the countryside to apply to all the land east of the road and help resist any attempts to seek new development, especially around the junctions. Unfortunately, this proposal has not been supported by Crossgates Ward Councillors and it is unlikely to be agreed by Leeds City Council.

**Next Steps:** Responses to the drop-in sessions and ways to deal with the challenges outlined above are being evaluated. # Thank you, John, from everyone in the village for all the years of unstinting service to Barwick in Bloom

Almost 27 years ago John Tinker MBE played a major role in the formation of Barwick in Bloom and was elected as Chairman. He has continued to lead the team of volunteers in transforming the environment of the village. It is difficult to visualize but back then there were no flower beds or baskets, no Jubilee Gardens, no community orchard, no daffodils or trees on the verges welcoming you to the village, no beds or planters in Main Street and too many other things to mention that are taken for granted today.

All these changes were made under John's careful leadership as well as moving us from 19<sup>th</sup> out of 20 in Yorkshire in Bloom in 1996 (when we only had one flower bed!) to achieve a Gold Award in Yorkshire in Bloom on at least fifteen occasions and Gold in Britain in Bloom on three occasions, no small feat for our village and Barwick In Bloom.

John has now handed the baton of Chairman to Peter Williams. John has accepted the role of President of Barwick in Bloom so that we can continue to benefit from his wealth of knowledge and expertise
