## The Parish Council would like to wish all residents a very Merry Christmas and best wishes for 2024



The Parish Council has had a turbulent year with many changes of members on the council. In September Alexandra Cantello has stepped down from the council for personal reasons and we wish her well. There are now four vacancies on the council two in Scholes Ward and two in Barwick Ward.

Anyone aged 18 years of age who lives locally can become a councillor. The role of a Parish Councillor includes working to identify issues which are important to the lives of the residents. In addition, councillors influence the long-term development policy for the parish, and comment on planning applications in the parish. The pavilion is also home to the Post Office which is open every Thursday from 13.00 to 15.00. Thank you to all the volunteers who provide refreshments at Scholes Post Office. The money collected is donated to the local branch of the Royal British Legion. Currently they have raised over £100. Thank you to everyone for their generosity.

The sports associations which use the PC land, have reported a very successful year with increasing interest by residents particularly in tennis at Barwick and bowling in Scholes. Cricket continues to be popular and the Verity strip at Barwick has been repaired. Barwick Village Hall have installed a new kitchen and continue to host a range of activities.

The Parish Council have agreed to keep the MUGA pitch open without the use of fobs for future monitoring. The gates will be locked as dusk.

Parish Christmas Lights Competition The PC are encouraging people to decorate their gardens and houses over the Christmas season. There will be a prize for the best decorated house or garden in each village. The PC will continue to provide Christmas lights in both villages however, the increasing costs of providing lights is becoming prohibitive. The PC is investigating future lighting projects to make them more environmentally sustainable, solar powered lights are being considered. If you have expertise in this area and can help, please let us know. Any help and ideas from residents would be welcomed.

Watch out for scammers! Do you need oven gloves or tea towels? Trading Standards urges residents to beware of cold callers, often telling sob stories of being ex-prisoners or working on probation schemes. No such projects are known to exist. This scam often involves young men, trying to sell poor-quality dusters, dishcloths door to door, using fake permits or licences. Cold callers can often be very persuasive. Scammers want you to open the door so they assess the home and note promising addresses, which could then be passed to burglars for cash. JUST SAY NO THANKS.

**Rakehill Road Improvement** LCC have carried out improvements to Rakehill Road. Planings from the works at Scholes Lane end have been laid along the road from its junction with Stockheld Lane to Rakehill Farm. Whilst not a long-term solution, it will provide a much better surface for walkers, cyclists and horse riders

for the next few years It will no longer be a struggle through deep mud to navigate the route. It will provide quicker and easier access for those residents of Barwick who use the new MUGA facilities in Scholes. It will also provide a key link for cyclists who wish to connect between the West Yorkshire cycleway which runs through Barwick and the new routes alongside ELOR which can be accessed along Station Road and Wood Lane. Motor vehicles are prohibited except for access.

Celebrations were held in St Philip's church with performances from Scholes Elderberries Brass Group, Folk Singers and Scholes Happy Together Choir. **Armistice Day** on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month in 1918, officially marked the cessation of hostilities and the armistice was signed.
