Parish Council Budget Decisions

The new budget for 2024/2025 has been approved and it is with regret that the PC agreed to increase the 2024/2025 precept by 8%. This will increase the total annual precept from \pounds 43,000 to just over \pounds 46,000. This decision has been made in order to secure sufficient funding for the future maintenance and upkeep of parish assets with increasing costs and a growing list of assets that need maintaining.

The average **annual** precept cost per household is £28, depending on the council tax band. For example if your PC precept was £28 last year it will be £30.24 this year and if £32.90 last year increases to £35.53. We have been very careful to keep costs as low as possible. As usual it will be collected by Leeds City Council via the Council Tax. You can see how much you pay on the LCC Council Tax bill.

In 2022/23 the budget contained significant items such as improved drainage at Scholes football pitch and improvements to the Verity Strip, Barwick.

The PC is also responsible for **4** defibrillators **in the parish** which have to be maintained even if not used. They are located in the following places

Barwick: Outside the Post Office and Village Hall

Scholes: Outside Osman House, entrance to the sports pavilion.

Always phone 999 and ask for an ambulance before using a defibrillator We are trying to introduce a long-range plan and in order to do that we would like to hear residents' opinion regarding future projects. Please let us know if you have any ideas that can be added to the plan for the next 3 years. Please contact the Clerk. Gentle reminder dogs are not allowed on Jack Heaps Field

As this is a children's play area.

Please keep your dog under control and on a lead on Scholes and Barwick Playing Fields where cricket and football are played and also used by children. Please do not let your dog foul in these areas and clean up after them.

Electric scooters: it is currently **illegal** in the UK to use a privately owned electric scooter on public roads, pavements or cycle lanes. Electric scooters can only be legally used on private land with the permission of the landowner. You are legally entitled to buy, sell and own an electric scooter.

Please do not use them in the villages.

Scholes Bridge, good news

Thank you, the efforts by Ward Councillors to get Scholes Bridge cleaned up have resulted in success. Initially HRE could not do any repairs as there was a water leak underneath that needed inspection. That is now complete and repair works are underway, repainting is scheduled in if not already underway.

Barwick Allotments

Allotment holders in Barwick have continued their discussions to take over control of the allotments from the PC. A management committee of at least 5 people will be required. New agreements will be issued and a lease agreed with the PC. Currently there are a few plots available. Review of Barwick in Elmet and Scholes Neighbourhood Plan

The Plan is currently being reviewed to take into consideration the changes that have occurred locally since the plan was originally agreed. Drop-in sessions were held in Barwick and Scholes to give residents the opportunity to review the current Neighbourhood Plan. A key issue raised by residents was the poor connectivity between the villages; including the lack of public transport and the poor condition of existing rights of way. A further issue identified the desire to retain and improve the character of the villages and designate more green spaces ensuring these are protected. How the revised Plan can deal with these is being examined.

The current Plan does not address how the parish may respond to climate change. LCC have recently published proposals to encourage solar farms and wind turbines in open countryside and the Plan will need to consider how this should be implemented locally.

External pressures include the proposals to build over 5,000 new houses on land between the new road and the edge of Leeds. It is estimated over a 10 to15 year period the local population will increase by 15,000; putting an enormous strain on existing services such as transport, education and health. Whilst the new development will bring additional facilities these will need to be managed carefully to avoid an unacceptable impact on existing facilities in the parish. The Plan will have a limited role in this regard but the Group will seek to ensure the Plan takes these challenges into account.

Scholes Lane End Junction Improvement and impact of ELOR

The junction improvements at Scholes Lane end have now been completed and is now much safer and easier to use. The new traffic lights make it easier to make right turns into Scholes Lane and right turns from Scholes Lane onto the A64 towards York. The new junction arrangement should also be helpful to residents living at Morwick Terrace.

In recognition that the route is popular with cyclists, the pavement has been designated for dual use by cyclists and pedestrians. The use of the pavement allows cyclists to avoid riding on the busy A64 and also allows them to access the bridleways on ELOR as well as crossing over the A64 to the new path connecting to Thorner Lane near the entrance to the cemetery. Cyclists using these dual use pavements, must take care near pedestrians and give way to pedestrians.

Impact of ELOR on traffic in the Parish, have your say!

The ELOR has been open for over 12 months, and Scholes Lane end junction improvements completed. It would be useful to have residents' views on changes to traffic levels in the villages. Have you noticed changed as motorists alter routes to take account of the new roads and layouts? In particular it has been noted that residents from Barwick are using Leeds Road to access ELOR. In the past Barwick experienced higher traffic volumes during rush hours from Garforth traffic along Long Lane. It is understood that the volume of traffic using this route towards Leeds has declined significantly in recent months.

LCC advised that it would monitor changes in traffic levels on the local highway network to consider if further work was necessary to address any consequential problems. Whilst this study is not imminent, the Neighbourhood Plan Group would welcome comments from residents about any adverse issues they believe have arisen following the recent highway changes, and whether the two issues mentioned above are recognised by people in these areas.

John Tinker MBE 1937-2024



John was well known in Barwick for his outstanding support for 'Barwick in Bloom' since his retirement in 1993, he remained Chairman until a year ago, when he became President. He was Director of Parks for Leeds from 1986, and was influential in transforming parks and green spaces across the city including Temple Newsam. He was also a long-standing member of the Parish Council. He will also be remembered by many for running the Youth Club in the village and for his unstinting support for the Methodist Church. He was awarded the MBE in 2009 for service to the community, which was

more deserved than most. He represents all that is best in the Yorkshire character and the results of his work have touched the lives of all of us who live in and visit Leeds. He was always thinking of others and he will be greatly missed.



Michael Holliday 1935-2023

Michael served in the RAF and was well known for his golf skills and joined Garforth Golf Club in 1970, he was Captain and President. He was also active in a wide range of groups in the community; he was Chair of the local British Legion for 20 years and help restore aircraft at Yorkshire air Museum; Scholes Players; Scholes Show; Scholes in Bloom; Bowling Club; Scholes Community Care; Bell Ringing in Barwick; Scholes Peace Flame and Elderberries Brass Group. He will be sadly missed by family and friends.
