Parish Council Updates

The Annual General Meeting was held on Monday 12th May in Scholes Pavilion. Three residents attended and issues of Christmas Lights and use of Barwick football pitch were was raised.

Chair's Report to Barwick in Elmet and Scholes Parish Council (PC) May 2025

I should like to welcome new councillors Chris Shoesmith and Brian Foxcroft (both Barwick), and Phil Maude has rejoined the council (Scholes). Unfortunately, Councillor Gillian Williamson has resigned due to personal reason and we wish her well. Two vacancies remain in Barwick and one in Scholes. Although there is a reduced number of councillors the current team work extremely well together, keeping the Parish Council business on track, and taking on additional duties where necessary. The Clerk also works incredibly hard supporting councillors and residents. Previous councillor Professor David Young died May 2025; our condolences are sent to his family.

The precept for 2025/2026 has been increased. This has been necessary as costs of maintaining PC assets continue to rise. The PC hopes to secure the purchase of Scholes allotments and negotiations are ongoing.

The PC made a substantial contribution towards the new Scholes playground. Plans are ongoing to upgrade the playground in Barwick and public consultation is included at the end of this Newsletter. The Christmas Lights in both villages are welcomed, but the high costs are a heavy burden on the budget. Alternative lighting and sources of energy use are being considered. Thank you to residents who continue to provide an interesting and exciting range of additional Christmas lights at this time of the year.

During the year the Planning Committee has responded to planning applications, however, decisions are ultimately made by Leeds City Council. This is becoming a disappointing task as LCC frequently ignore objections and allow planning proposals to proceed which are not viewed as beneficial for the parish.

The Peace Flame Group worked with both primary schools and Scholes Scouts to design a Peace Flame Flag, now installed in the Peace Flame Garden. Thank you to the schools and Scouts and all the children who submitted designs; the project is part of the ongoing educational project linked with peace.

Our sports organisations have all had good seasons. Two sports meetings a year are held and these are well attended. A new football club is now based at Barwick. Scholes MUGA pitch is free to use by all residents and fobs are not required to gain entrance. The MUGA is closed overnight.

Cllr Phil Maude continues to lead the review of The Neighbourhood Plan, which has been paused as they review the Leeds Local Plan. Residents are urged to get involved in commenting on future LCC's housing plans. The revised Neighbourhood Plan will be open to public consultation and will take place in the near future.

Thanks to all the Parish Councillors and the Clerk for their time and help and support they have given me throughout the year. Councillor Paul Walsh attends the PACT meetings and is Safeguarding Officer for the PC.

Cllr Stella Walsh Chair 2024/2025

Future Housing Development in the Parish – Make your views known

It is likely that housing allocations will have to be made in the Parish.

LCC are preparing a Plan for future development in the city up to 2040. This involves allocating new sites for housing and renewable energy. LCC is required by government to identify land to build **82,371 new homes** at a rate of **3,811 per annum**. The aim is to provide much of this housing in the city centre and the urban areas but some land will need to be allocated in rural areas and some release of green belt land may be required. LCC are also carrying out a review of the green belt. The sites that landowners/developers have put forward can be viewed at

"Leeds Local Plan 2040" on the internet. <u>https://barwickandscholespc.org/wp-content/uploads/2025/04/Leeds-Local-Plan-Update-report-18.3.25.pdf</u> The call for sites does not mean those sites will be built on, it merely means that the landowner has asked the council to assess the viability for development. More details will be provided on the PC website once they have been published.

LCC have published their site assessment of the housing and other sites ready for the consultation process.

In the document go to Appendix 1b site assessment and look for Outer North East to find a map and the sites that have been considered. These plans will be open to public consultation due to start in June. Details of how sites will be assessed and scored are also included. A summary is detailed **below**.

On the site-specific assessments, the suggestion at present is that planning officers will consult on how they've ranked sites as:

Green sites that are generally sustainable with limited negative impacts.

Yellow sites that could be sustainable if *some* negative impacts are mitigated or addressed.

Orange sites that could be sustainable if *many* negative impacts are mitigated or addressed.

Red sites that could only be sustainable if impacts on key indicators are avoided.

The NHP group will be in touch with more details once the council launches its consultation. **Residents are strongly encouraged to participate in the consultation process so that your views can be taken into consideration.**

Progress on the revision of the Neighbourhood Plan will be paused until the site allocations are known.


Keith Langley is Clerk to the PC and works part-time.
