

# Barwick in Elmet and Scholes Parish Council Newsletter September 2025

The Parish Council needs new volunteers; the PC comprises 12 members. There is one vacancy for a councillor in Scholes Ward and three vacancies for councillors in the Barwick Ward.

Anyone who lives locally and is over 18 years of age can be co-opted to become a councillor. The role of a Parish Councillor includes working to identify issues which are important to the lives of the residents you represent, particularly those that will help improve the environment in the local area. The Parish Council wish to send their condolences to **David Leeming's family**. David served as a Parish Councillor for the Barwick Ward from 2007-2016. He was also very active in the Scout Movement and was the Treasurer for The Ancient Barwick and Elmet Charitable Trust.

Councillor Paul Walsh attended the August PACT meeting. Police crime data noted that violent crimes in the area were up. Burglaries had also increased but no suggestions for reason. Full details can be found on the PC website

#### The following local issues were raised:

A violent assault in Scholes; haybales being set on fire in Barwick; males intimidating residents in Barwick and speeding in the villages. The lack of Police presence in the villages given the above events was raised. The police have agreed to increase their monitoring of speeding on the roads in the parish.

#### Summary

Major development within the plan period in the parish is unwelcome and unnecessary. Instead, a number of small sites could be identified to provide a range of locations and choices.

#### Tree planting in the parish, volunteers wanted.

In November the **Woodland Trust**, are providing 205 trees and 120 hedge saplings to be planted in land owned by the Parish Council.

Volunteers are needed to collectively plant these trees across our villages.

Everyone is welcome and every voice is important to ensure we achieve our goal of protecting our environment but not in a way that removes or diminishes our needed playing areas and facilities. Please note that we are not planting forests every tree must be considered and appropriate for the space and not detach from the purpose of the area it is being planted in.

The PC would love the children from the local schools and scouts to be part of this project as essentially; we are aiming to protect their environment and their children's environment.
